4-H Record Books

Recordkeeping is a valuable skill taught to members of the Texas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep project records and have these records reviewed annually by submitting a Texas 4-H Record Book. The primary purposes of completing a Record Book are for a young person to develop the skills necessary to set goals, work toward achieving those goals, reflect on his/her experiences, and set new and higher goals for themselves. A secondary benefit is to prepare young people for the process of completing academic scholarship and/or collegiate admission applications.

Recordkeeping – maintaining a history of one's activities such as financial dealings or life events by entering data in ledgers, journals, calendars or putting items into a file system; an essential life skill.

4-H Record Book – the competitive event where 4-H members assemble their records into a specified document and submit those for evaluation against other 4-H members. However, one may choose to complete a record book just for the skill learned and not elect to submit for competition.

Note* 4-H members must submit a Texas 4-H record book in the year they are to be considered for 4-H awards and to attend Record Book Water Park Trip.

District Officer Elections take place at District 3 Teen Leader Lab. If you aspire to serve as a District Officer or State 4-H Council Member, you should attend this camp as soon as you are eligible – the summer after your 8th grade year.

Planning to run for District Office?

- Officer applications are due to the County Office by May 25th.
- Note that newly elected District 3 Council Officers will be required to attend a district officer retreat.
- Note that if running for District President or District Vice President you will also be committing to serve on state 4-H Council and will be required to attend the 2021-2022 Texas 4-H Council Workshop scheduled for July 20-23 at the Texas 4-H Conference Center.
- To run for a district office, candidates must be between the ages of 14 and 18 as of August 31 of the current 4-H year.
- To run for President or 1st Vice President, the 4-H member must be between the ages of 16 and 18 as of August 31 of the 4-H year they serve.

AWARD	CRITERIA
BRONZE STAR	Presented up to two outstanding 4-H junior members (grades 3rd – 5th). May be received one time only. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
SILVER STAR	Presented to up to two outstanding 4-H Intermediate members (grades 6th - 8th.) May be received one time only. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
GOLD STAR	Awarded each year to up to three outstanding Senior 4-H members (must have completed 9th grade - 12th) in Hardeman County based on their total 4- H career. A member may receive the Gold Star Award only one time. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
DANFORTH I DARE YOU	Awarded each year to two outstanding senior 4-H members who offered excellence in character and well-balanced personal development as well as demonstrated leadership. May be received one time only. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria. *Award recipients receive a personalized award certificate, a copy of I Dare You!, William H. Danforth's classic motivational
	book, and an invitation to join other young leaders at the National Leadership Conference.
4-H SERVICE MEDAL	Recognition awarded to 4-H member, (Junior, Intermediate, or Senior age) for outstanding community service and volunteer work. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
4-HLEADERS & ACHIEVERS MEDAL	Recognition awarded to 4-H member, (Junior, Intermediate, or Senior age) for outstanding leadership on the project, club, and or county level. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
