4-H Record Books

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4-H Record Books –

A Texas 4-H Record Book consists of information that a 4-H member records over the course of a 4-H year that documents his/her goals, knowledge and skills gained, leadership experiences, awards earned, and service in his/her community. Those experiences are recorded into forms, narratives, and a story/photo portfolio written by the 4-H member. The information is printed, bound in a cover, and is typically submitted for evaluation.

Record Books contain 4 parts: (all three age divisions: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior)

1. Check Sheet
2. Personal Information Page
3. 4-H Story & Photo Portfolio
4. Report Forms

District Officer Elections take place at District 3 Teen Leader Lab. If you aspire to serve as a District Officer or State 4-H Council Member, you should attend this camp as soon as you are eligible – the summer after your 8th grade year.

Planning to run for District Office?

- Officer applications are due to the County Office by May 25th.
- Note that newly elected District 3 Council Officers will be required to attend a district officer retreat.
- Note that if running for District President or District Vice President you will also be committing to serve on state 4-H Council and will be required to attend the 2021-2022 Texas 4-H Council Workshop scheduled for July 20-23 at the Texas 4-H Conference Center.



- To run for a district office, candidates must be between the ages of 14 and 18 as of August 31 of the current 4-H year.
- To run for President or 1st Vice President, the 4-H member must be between the ages of 16 and 18 as of August 31 of the 4-H year they serve.
- Let us know if you are interested in running for District office and we can help answer any questions you may have and send you the additional council officer information.
