Youth will go head-to-head to see who can make the most money, transforming unexpected diamonds in the rough into high dollar gems.

Youth can spend up to a maximum of \$50 on the item they will transform. Supplies may be purchased separately BUT will be added to overall cost of item. So, keep your receipts for all items purchased and a running total of items used that you already had on hand. You will want to keep costs low because the youth that makes the most net profit wins the 2022 4-H Flip!

Youth will have time over the month of August 1st – September 10th to transform their items for the Flip Reveal and Deal at the 39th Annual Quana Fall Fest on Saturday, September 10th.

4-H Flip Categories:

Storage - Any piece that can be used to store items.

Seating - A piece of furniture sturdy enough to be used for seating. Chair, bench, etc.

Lighting - Includes lighting such as floor, table, and pendant lamps, (update wiring if not new)

Home Accessory - An item used to accessorize and enhance the space, i.e. Baskets, bins, candles and holders, wall hangings - mirrors, art, photos, rugs, pillows.

Transformation - a piece that was used for something else and has been transformed into a new use.

Color - Any piece where the color is changed by painting, staining, or sanding.
