Hardeman County 4-H



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9V has been the battery of choice for smoke alarms for many years. However, nowadays, it is more common to see two or three AA's in smoke detectors. AA batteries have about three times as much energy as a 9V.

When using batteries like these, it's important that you check them consistently and replace your smoke alarm batteries every 6 months.



A good reminder is to change your smoke detector batteries every time you change your clock for Daylight Saving Time.

4-H Club Members check with people in your community to see what type batteries are needed. Hold a club battery drive and then offer to change batteries for your community.


