



Award	Criteria
Bronze Star	Presented up to two outstanding 4-H junior members (grades 3 <sup>rd</sup> -5 <sup>th</sup> ). May be received one time only. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as criteria.
Silver Star	Presented up to two outstanding 4-H intermediate members (grades 6 <sup>th</sup> -8 <sup>th</sup> ). May be received one time only. Must complete a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
Gold Star	Awarded each year to up to three outstanding Senior 4-H members (must have completed grades 9 <sup>th</sup> -12 <sup>th</sup> ) in Hardeman County based on their total 4-H career. A member may receive the Gold Star Award only one time. Must complete a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
Danforth, I Dare You	Awarded each year to two outstanding senior 4-H members who offered excellence in character and well-balanced personal development as well as demonstrated leadership. May be received one time only. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
4-H Service Medal	Recognition awarded to 4-H member, (Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Age) for outstanding community service and volunteer work. Must complete and submit a 4-H Record Book as award criteria.
4-H Leaders and Achievers Medal	Recognition awarded to 4-H members, (Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Age) for outstanding leadership on the project, club, and or county level. Must complete and submit a 4-H record book as award criteria.
